The 1995 Dixie Zone Short Course Yards Championships were held at Dynamo Swim Center in Atlanta on March 18-19. Thirty-eight teams were in attendance, including at least one team from each LMSC in the Dixie Zone. Host club Georgia Masters Killer Whales led participation with 77 swimmers and team points with 1231. Following GMKW in team standings was a close race among several teams: North Carolina Masters (567), Birmingham Swim League Masters (491), Dynamo Masters (459), BAMA Masters (400), and Greater Knoxville Masters (396). A total of 267 swimmers entered the meet, the largest ever for the St. Patrick's Day meet.

It took dozens of volunteers to handle a variety of duties such as concession stand, seeding, results, social, officials, registration table, t-shirts, timers, sponsors, and clean up.
