#### WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

swimmers from the USA 319 traveled Sheffield, England for the VI World Masters Swimming Championships held June 22nd-July 3rd. A total of 4555 competitors entered the meet from 46 countries. 3837 swimmers were entered in the swimming competition of which 2045 were men and 1792 were women. The largest group of swimmers were from Great Britain (1641), 484 were from Germany, 455 from Japan and 292 from There were 175 divers, synchronized swimmers, 31 water polo teams and 406 entered in the open water swim. The first FINA Masters World Forum was held on June 21st with representatives from 16 Federations. Mel Goldstein and Jim Miller represented USAS (USMS). This Forum is intended to be held every four years prior to the FINA Masters World Swimming Championships. Discussions involved Venues, Programming - Days and Events, Qualifying Times, Entry Limitation, Cost, Officials and other. The FINA Masters Committee members were in attendance and considered all suggestions during their three day meeting following the competition. Championships were well organized and the registration of the participants went smoothly. Malcolm Hill from the Organizing Committee was a very effective and cooperative meet director. The marshalling was well organized and carried out with a friendly tone. When it appeared that the starter was not familiar with the Masters starting rule he was quickly informed by the Chief Referee Arthur Knudsen. One of the goals of the FINA Masters Committee was that the meet should not last more than ten hours a day. There was only one day where the meet ran over ten hours and that was Day 2 which ran until 6:30 pm. There were 194 disqualifications (men-117 and women-77). The main reasons for the disqualifications were 1) Breaststroke - one hand touches, dolphin kicks after start and turn; 2) Backstroke - turning onto stomach too early before the turn, kicking before the turning action and turning onto stomach before touching at the finish; 3) Butterfly - arms not simultaneous during

recovery and underwater recovery; and 4) Relays Early takeoffs. There were a total of 92 swims that exceeded the existing Masters World Records (men-47, women-41 and relays-4). June Krauser, Florida Gold Coast, swam and won five events breaking 7 world records. You ask how? In the 800 m free June broke the existing 200 m and 400 m with her split times. Her other firsts were in the 100 and 200 m flys and the 200 and 400 m IMs. Joe Kurtzman, South Carolina, broke two world records winning the 100 and 200 m flys with a second in the m fly. Anne McGuire, Florida Gold Coast, won the 200 m fly, was second in the 200 m breast and 400 m IM, third in the 100 m breast and 4th in the 50 m breast. JoPaul Steiner, Southern, was 2nd in the 50 breast and 3rd in the 50 m free and 100 m breast. Janice Krauser, Florida Gold Coast, swam the 50 m fly and met her goal of not being last! St. Pete had six swimmers at the meet. Florence Carr won the 50 m fly and was 2nd in the 50, 100, 200 & 800 m frees. Sandy Steer swam the 200 m free and the three breaststrokes. Harold Ferris was there with a bad cold and I know he was 10th in the 50 free. Thomas Smith was 4th in the 50 back, 6th in the 50 fly and 9th in the 200 IM. Mike Torsney was 2nd in the 100 fly, 5th in the 200 fly, 8th in the 400 IM and he swam the 200 Breast and 200 IM. Couldn't find Sam Hall as I don't know his age! Bill Robertson from South Carolina did well winning the 200 m free, 2nd in the 100 m free, 5th in the 200 IM and 8th in both the 800 free and 50 fly.

A questionnaire was given to all competitors and there were 592 returned by the swimmers. As a result of the questionnaire, the FINA World Forum, and the observations during the Championships, the following recommendations were approved by the FINA Masters Committee to submitted to the FINA Bureau consideration to be included in the World Masters Swimming Championships to be held in Casablanca in 1998. 1) Inclusion of the 400 m freestyle to be swum on the same day as the 800 m free, and with choice of one of the two events to be pre-seeded by time regardless of age-group with two swimmers per lane. maximum of 5 individual events plus two relays

with two individual events plus relay per day. 3) Program of events like Sheffield with the exchange of the 400 and 200 IM's and female and male start events first on alternate days. 4) Qualifying standards on all events 200 meters and up. The standard based on the 10th time in the current World Top Ten listing plus 13% in 25-44 age groups and 16% in 45+ age groups. Note: These recommendations must be approved by the FINA Bureau.

In 1998 the FINA Masters Congress will be held where rules may be amended by the Federations. It was also recommended that we add the No False Start Rule for Masters competition. Members of the FINA Masters Committee expressed concern with respect to the staging of the Championships in Casablanca, due to the non availability of information from the Organizing both during the Championships and at the Organizer's booth. The Committee recommended that the FINA Office/Executive Committee followup with the Casablanca Organization to determine the status of the Championships.

There will be a special edition of the FINA Masters News covering these Championships available in September. The first three places in each event will be listed for all five disciplines. #### THE OLYMPICS

Dynamo in Georgia - On June 10th, Dynamo held a press conference to honor it's two Olympic Swimmers, Eric Wunderlich & Carlo Bruner. They have been an inspiration to their fellow swimmers. Also on June 10th, Dynamo dedicated their new facility in Alpharetta. This facility has both a competition and an instruction pool. Dynamo will be a practice facility for the Olympic water polo teams this summer. On June 18 through July 5, Synchro Canada will be training at Dynamo from 11 am to 3 pm.

ISHOF in Ft. Lauderdale - There have been a multitude of foreign teams working out this summer. You hear Spanish in one pool and at the same time German in the other pool. Several of the swimmers on the Ft. Lauderdale Swim Team will be competing for their native Countries. June Krauser flew to Atlanta on July 16th to attend a USAS (United States Aquatic Sports) reception for all of the FINA

Federations attending the Olympics. • It was nice to be a little part of the Big Show! Gold Coast Masters swimmer, Mary Ann Meekins, was awarded a certificate from the ISHOF proclaiming her a member of the mythical Olympic Team for 1944. "I was surprised and honored," she said. "It made me very, very proud." For those of you too young to know, the war stopped the Olympics in 1940 & 1944.



#### Team Orlando Masters Short Course Meters Swim Meet

Dates: October 11, 12 and 13, 1996.

Meet Director: Larry Peck (407) 647-7793 (emergencies only).

Sanction: Sanctioned by Florida LMSC for USMS, Inc. Sanction Number: 146-019.

Sponsor: Team Orlando Masters in conjunction with the YMCA Aquatic Center.

Designation: This meet has been designated the Dixie Zone Short Course Meters Championship meet.

Eligibility: All athletes 19 years of age and older as of October 11, 1996 and registered with USMS, Inc. Non-U.S. citizens should have a letter of introduction from their own swimming association.

Facilities: The YMCA Aquatic Center pools will be used for this meet. The short course meters pool is a deep 8 lane pool with a fully automatic timing system. An 8 lane 25 yard pool will be available for warm up and cool down. Both pools are indoors.

Schedule: Warm up begins Friday at 5:30 PM. The 1500 Free will begin at 6:30 PM. Warm up begins Saturday & Sunday at 8 AM. The Saturday & Sunday events will begin at 9 AM.

Seeding Times: Please show your best meters time during the last two years. Heats will be seeded by time regardless of age with the slowest heat first in each event. You must submit a time for each event entered.

Entries and Fccs: Swimmers must pre-enter by mail. Entry deadline is Thursday, October 3rd. It is your responsibility to mail your entry early enough to meet the deadline. A maximum of five individual events per day may be entered. Send the completed and signed entry form with a check. Each event entry must be submitted on the entry form, filled out completely with your name, phone number, club, birthdate, event numbers circled, 1996 USMS registration number and seeding times. The scoring of the event will be computerized. Please be sure all information and the signed waiver are filled out on the entry form. The fees are: \$2.50 per event and a \$10 meet charge. The meet charge covers the electronic timing and scoring costs and the cost of printing the heat sheets. Relay teams can be deck entered during the meet both Saturday and Sunday. There is no charge for relay teams. Only team members registered for this meet may swim in a relay. Please send a self addressed stamped envelope if you wish to confirm your entry.

Age Groups: Individuals: 19-24, 25-29, 30-34, etc. up to 90+. Relays: 76+, 100+, 120+, 160+, 200+, etc.

You must send a copy of your 1996 registration card with your entry. You cannot swim without it.

Heat Sheets and Results: Heat sheets are included in the meet charge. Results may be ordered at the meet. One free copy will be given to each team (team representatives should indicate so on their entry form).

Awards: Awards for 1st through 6th in each event. Individual high point awards for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in all age groups. High point awards will only be awarded post-competition on Sunday, October 13th, after points are officially totaled. Swimmers departing early should have friends pick up awards or make other arrangements. Team awards will be given for the combined visiting men and women's 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.

Points: 9-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 for individual events. Double points for relays.

Rules and officials: Current masters swimming rules will govern. There will be a certified stroke and turn judge, starter and referee for all events.

Directions: The YMCA Aquatic Center is off exit 29 of Interstate 4. Take 482 East to the 1st intersection (International Drive). Turn right on International Drive for 1/2 mile. Turn right on Jamaican Court to the Radisson Hotel. The YMCA signs are to the right in the Radisson parking lot.

Social: A social will be held at Lucky and Jacquie Meisenheimer's home on Saturday evening. Come join us and play with Lucky's vast array of games and toys including the water volleyball court.


Additional comments: Masters swimming is a strenuous physical activity and each participant should first consult with his/her personal physician.
