## MAKE IT MAUI - PAN PACIFIC MASTERS SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS

June 23-29, 1997 Lahaina, Maui

It was the dream of the powers that be when the Lahaina Aquatic Center opened in August 1992. It became a reality when the Pan Pacific Masters Swim Meet brought 1111 over-25 swimmers to Maui. From the old - -91 year old 1920 Olympic gold medalist Aileen Soule of Honolulu - to the young (swimmers must be at least 25 for Masters International competition), it was a meet to remember for most of the competitors mainly because it is hard to imagine a more unique setting than the LAC, which sits less than a half-mile from the Pacific Ocean and under the scenic gaze of the West Maui Mountains.

Janet Renner founded the Maui Masters Swim Club in 1991 and has watched the sport grow on the Valley Isle ever since. MMSC now boasts more than 100 members and Renner was the first Mauian in action at the meet finishing sixth in the 400 m IM in the 35-39 age group. It was, however, her first race in a pool in more than a decade. While she trains and coordinates MMSC pool workouts, the ocean is where she shines competitively.

No one can say that Linda Crockett Lingle does not get into the swim of things as mayor of Maui County. Maui's No. one politician took a little time out of her busy schedule of running the county to take a dip in the pool competing in two relay events. This was the sixth Pan Pacific meet and it was a conglomeration of efforts with Maui County workers, youth swim club members, and others in the community. Of the 1111 competitors, 445 were from the US, 291 from Japan, 119 from Brazil and 66 from Australia with 23 countries in all competing. The first Pan Pacific Masters Championships were held in 1981 in Sydney, Australia. The second one was also held in Sydney in 1983. The 3<sup>rd</sup> meet was held in 1989 in Indianapolis, the 4<sup>th</sup> in 1991 in Tokyo and the 5<sup>th</sup> in Hamilton, New Zealand in 1993.

Three Members of the Organizing Committee for the VII World Masters Swimming Championships to be held in Casablanca, Morocco on June 19-30, 1998 were in attendance to distribute the Entry Booklet and Accommodation Guide - Farid El Allam, General Secretary, Mohamed Atouani, Officials' Director and Zouheir El Moufti, Financial Director. Janice Krauser was the photographer snapping numerous pictures during the meet for SWIM magazine. Look for the article in the next issue to be written by Paul Windrath -- meet director. The meet was run by USMS and this was the first time that the National Organization took on the task of running

a meet. The meet officials came from Japan, New Zealand and the US. The processing of the entries was done by Ginger Pierson and Suzanne Rague. The administrative support volunteer included June Krauser, Walt Reid, Sandi Neilson-Bell, Jack and Peggy Buchannan, Mel Goldstein, Mary Beth Windrath and Cassie Shapley. All of this was put together by the very capable meet director -- Paul Windrath.

Dixie Zone was well represented at the meet. I tried to get the results of as many as I could identify from the results listed on the wall. However, with my bifocals and the results high it was difficult. WHO'S CARL HOUSE By Randy Nutt, Chairman, Florida Gold Coast LMSC

We've known of Carl as the fellow who has built web sites for each of the Dixie Zone LMSC's and for three Colonies Zone LMSC's as well, and as the guy who put the USMS Top Ten on the world wide web. Before that, he published the Florida Gold Coast Newsletter for four years, putting out sixteen issues that we were proud of. His next accomplishment, he says, will be to make it possible to type your name into the Internet and get back your personal Top Ten history back to 1993. Who is this fellow, and what makes him put so much into swimming?

Carl started swimming ten years ago because he had severe back pain and a newspaper story about Judy Bonning made him think swimming might help. His complete story, along with stories about many other of Judy's people is on her web page: http://www.swimgold.org/gold/judybnng.htm. In short, he's terribly grateful to Judy for providing the motivation to become a swimmer and within a year he was totally free of pain. He sees clearly he can't quit swimming, saying he's condemned to swim for the rest of his life to stay pain free. I think that's good news for us.

Judy invited Carl to the annual LMSC meeting in 1991, and June Krauser, seeing he seemed always to have something to say, put him in charge of "communications". He served as Vice-Chairman of our LMSC for four years, and since then has served as our Web-Master, though he prefers the title "Web-Steward". His contributions to swimming have been continuous and substantial now for seven years and he

shows no signs of letting up.

He's not a bad swimmer. His first great victory as a swimmer, he says, was getting on a relay team with Flo Carr and letting her time pull them all into the Top Ten. He's always available for a relay. He even got a national second place medal in 1996 Y-Nationals on a team with June Krauser, Anne McGuire, and Cav Cavanaugh. They were so amused by how happy he was with his second place medal that they gave him a certificate to hang on his wall. It's still there. With continued good coaching and dedication, he's gotten good enough to make Top Ten on his own, and has now made it approximately ten times. He makes it most often, he says, "squeaking into SCM in the 200 fly; he's basically a social swimmer". His key to serious training is finding a swimming partner. His Mission Bay swimming partner, Ralph Rogers, was as important as Judy Bonning was to making sure he got to the pool several times a week and got in a good workout. Now Brenda Weber is his best-buddy at Meadows Park Pool in Boca Raton. He can't seem to say enough good things about her and their new coach, Jonathan Coyle.

Some people feel that because of his effort the USMS Top Ten may now become a far more powerful motivater and promotional tool for USMS. He's built the SwimGold web site which hosts the home pages for ten LMSC's and, even more importantly, presents the USMS Top Ten in important new wavs. You can now go to the Top Ten on-line and find out who grongest swimmers in your age group are, who all the Top

Ten swimmers in your LMSC are, and you can find stories and photographs for about 100 of our All-Americans. And more stories and photographs are being added every month. He's hoping that by the time SCY Top Ten comes out that you'll be able to go to the Top Ten on-line, type your name, and get back a count of how many times your name appears in the newest publication as well as your complete Top Ten history since 1993. Of course, you can also check on your competition this

Carl says this web site couldn't have been built without the help of Dorothy Donnelly, Meegan Wilson, Vicki Stewart, Esther Lyman, Ceil Blackwell, Tomi Richards, Meg Smath, George Olsen and others who have volunteered their efforts. Many All-Americans have sent in their own story. commercial artists have given permission for their work to be used without cost. Internet services are provided free of charge by Icanect. And he's gotten technical assistance not only from Icanect, but also from swimmers Don Graft and Dale Mason and USMS Webmaster, Jim Matysek.

The New Year's Day date limited entries to 35, yet every event was sprinkled with former Olympic swimmers, national champions, World and American record holders. 1952 Olympian Gay Rosser and 1956 (continued on page 3)

Olympian Dick Hanley competed together. 1941-1944 AAU National Champion Riviera Club team had three in the meet the Fogle sisters (Cynthia Bruce and June Krauser) and Mary Ann (alts) Meekins. The 1955 National Champion Walter Reed Swim Club was represented by Wanda (Werner) Cavanaugh and Peggy (Morris) Weinants with Shelly Mann assing out the medals. 1968 British Olympic co-captains Jill Stattery and Tony Jarvis were multiple winners. Marge Counsilman, recording the meet results got to record her husband's (Doc) 100 breaststroke winning time. A return of swimming's "over the hill gang". (SWIM-MASTER, Vol. I, No 1, Feb. 1972)


